WHAT DOES THE FUND INVEST IN?

The fund invests in dividend paying securities in the Canadian financial sector and employs a covered call option writing strategy on certain of those securities.

HOW RISKY IS IT?

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk Rating

Marquest Asset Management Inc. has rated the volatility of this fund as **low to medium**.

This rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.


Like most mutual funds, this fund doesn't have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

HOW HAS THE FUND PERFORMED?

This section tells you how Class F units of the fund have performed over the past 2 calendar years. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the fund’s returns.

Year-by-year returns

This chart shows how Class F units of the fund performed in the past 2 calendar years. The fund dropped in value in 1 of the 2 years. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the fund will perform in the future.



Best and worst 3-month returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for the Class F units of the fund in a 3-month period over the past 2 calendar years. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

Average return

As at May 31, 2017, a person who invested \$1,000 in Class F units at July 17, 2014 now has \$1,125. This works out to an annual compounded return of 4.17%.

WHO IS THIS FUND FOR?

Investors who:

- have medium term investment goals
- are seeking after tax income which will grow over time
- are seeking to, at the same time, preserve and enhance capital
- want to contribute to the income component of a diversified portfolio
- are willing to accept a low to medium level of risk

A WORD ABOUT TAX

In general, you’ll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Class F units of the fund. The fees and expenses – including any commissions – can vary among classes of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Sales Charges

Class F units are no load. That means you pay no sales charges if you buy, own and sell Class F units.

2. Fund Expenses

You don’t pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund’s returns.

As of December 31, 2016, the Class F expenses were 1.01% of its value. This equals \$10.10 for every \$1,000 invested.

	Annual rate (as a % of the fund’s value)
Management Expense Ratio (MER) This is the total of the fund’s management fee (including the trailing commission) and operating expenses. The fund manager waived some of the fund’s expenses. If the fund manager had not done so, the MER would have been higher.	0.92%
Trading Expense Ratio (TER) These are the fund’s trading costs.	0.09%
Fund Expenses	1.01%

More about trailing commission

Class F units have no trailing commissions.

3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch units of the fund.

Fee	What you pay
Short-term trading fee	2% of the value of units you sell or switch within 30 days of buying them. This fee goes to the fund.
Switch fee	Your representative's firm may charge you up to 2% of the value of units you switch to another Marquest Fund.
Class F fee	Your representative's firm may charge you a fee in respect of your investment, any such fee would be set out in an agreement between you and your representative's firm.

WHAT IF I CHANGE MY MIND?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form, Fund Facts or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
