Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

For the six month period ended June 30, 2021 the Fund's Series A/Regular shares returned 9.0%. This compared to the return for the S&P/TSX Equity Income Index of 22.8% and the S&P/TSX Composite Index of 15.7%. The Fund's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, while the benchmarks and broad based index returns do not include any similar costs of investing. See the Financial Highlights section for the management expense ratios and the Past Performance section for the returns of any other series, which may vary because of differences in management fees and expenses.

The Fund's underperformance was due to its overweighting in the utility sector which significantly underperformed the overall market and the Fund's underweighting in the energy, financials and healthcare sectors, all of which outperformed. As at June 30, 2021 the sector weightings of the portfolio were 16.11% real estate, 13.58% utilities, 10.97% energy, 10.13% consumer discretionary, 9.28% financials, 7.77% industrials, 3.14% mutual funds, 2.54% communication services and 7.36% cash. The Fund maintained a relatively high dividend yield during the period. At mid-year, the dividend yield of the invested portion of the portfolio was 4.24%.

As at June 30, 2021 the Fund's total NAV was \$4,015,573, an increase of 1.55% since the prior year end (December 2020: \$3,954,450). The change is due to net change in unrealized appreciation on investment of \$481,583 partially offset by net realized loss on sale of investments of \$81,426 and management fees of \$36,565.

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Recent Developments

The global economic recovery is well established due in major part to the massive fiscal and monetary stimulus initiatives undertaken by government authorities over the past several months. In addition, the prospects of the reopening of the economy as the vaccination process advanced in the next few months will further stimulate economic activity. While interest rates are still relatively low, they have begun to rise reflecting the concerns that the recovery in the economy may cause an increase in inflation. US 10 year treasury yields have increased from under 1% to 1.45% over the first six months of 2021.

The strong performance of the stock market over the past year in combination with rising interest rates suggests that equity markets may need time to consolidate these strong gains. Earnings are expected to be strong in the coming months. The question is how much of the earnings improvement has already been anticipated by equity markets? Stock selection will be more critical in the coming months as the equity market identifies the companies that will benefit most from the corporate earnings recovery which now appears to be taking hold.

Related Party Transactions

The Manager of the Fund is responsible for managing all of the Fund's activities, including investment advisory and portfolio management services under a Management Agreement. The Management Agreement is automatically renewed annually for one year terms, unless terminated by either party on at least 60 days prior notice. The Management Agreement may be terminated by either party if the other party is in material default of the performance of any of its duties under the Management Agreement and such default has not been remedied, or if the other party goes into liquidation, bankruptcy or ceases to hold appropriate regulatory approvals. The Manager may also be removed by an extraordinary resolution of unitholders. Management fees are paid by the Fund as set out under "Management Fees" below.

During the period, \$36,565 (2020 - \$39,920) in management fees (including HST) was paid to the Manager.

The higher a Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a Fund.

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Management and Performance Fees

The Management fees for each applicable series are calculated daily and are based on the Fund's ending total NAV per series; cumulative daily totals are then paid on a monthly basis. The Manager uses these management fees to pay sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund shares, as well as for the general investment management expenses.

The Fund will incur a performance fee equal to 20% x (Series % gain *minus* Benchmark % gain) x (Series Average NAV). The benchmark is 5% 60 day Canadian treasury bill rate, 10% BMO Nesbitt Burns Preferred Share index, 10% S&P TSX Utilities Index, 15% S&P TSX Income Trust Index, 20% S&P TSX Capped Financials Index and 40% S&P TSX 60 Index. Past Performance

The performance information shown assumes that all distributions made by the Fund in the periods shown were reinvested in additional securities of the Fund. The performance information does not take into account sales, redemptions, distributions or other optional charges that would have reduced returns or performance. How the Fund has performed in the past does not necessarily indicate how it will perform in the future. Performance differences between series of units are mainly attributable to management fees charged to each series.


Year-by-Year Returns


